

Tree	 <p>Citrofortunella microcarpa 'Calamondin Kumquat'</p>
Description	<p>Calamondin is considered a cross between mandarin and cumquat. As a tree, it has glossy deep-green leaves and grows between 3-6m tall. The fruit resembles a small, round lime, orange in colour when fully ripe and is great for cooking, in spices, jams, marmalades and preserves.</p>
Foliage	<p> Evergreen</p>
Form	<p> Oval</p>
Mature Size	<p>5 x 3m</p>
Uses	<p>As a fruiting tree it is suitable planted in multiples or as a single specimen in a garden or landscape. Great for pots on decks and terraces.</p>
Position & Soil	<p>This variety requires a position in full sun in a humus rich, well-drained soil. They are quite hungry so feed well and do not over water.</p>
