














<b>Tree</b>	 <p><b>Eucalyptus camaldulensis</b> RIVER RED GUM</p>
<b>Description</b>	Red River Gums are widespread in the Australian landscape, most commonly found along stream banks and rivers or in flood plains. They grow very tall with most trees exhibiting a stripy bark revealing pale grey, charcoal and occasionally pink colourings. Foliage is relatively short and narrow.
<b>Foliage</b>	 Evergreen
<b>Form</b>	 Oval
<b>Mature Size</b>	30 x 15m
<b>Uses</b>	As a big tree, it is most suitable for developments and landscapes that require a big native tree.
<b>Position &amp; Soil</b>	While they tolerate most soil types, River Red Gums prefer well-drained sites in full sun or part shade.
