









Tree	 <p>Malus domestica 'Granny Smith' GRANNY SMITH FRUITING APPLE</p>
Description	<p>A small fruiting tree, used as a feature in a small garden or planted in a group where there is more space. This variety of apple is tip bearing, with bright green skin. It has a tart flavour with a crisp texture.</p>
Foliage	<p> Deciduous</p>
Form	<p> Round</p>
Mature Size	<p>4 x 4m</p>
Uses	<p>One of the world's best cooking apples, originating from an Australian seedling. It is revered as a cooking apple, but should not be overlooked for an eating apple - if left on the tree to fully ripen. The fruit a long storage life.</p>
Position & Soil	<p>Plant in moderately fertile, moist, free-draining soil in full sun, although it will tolerate partial shade. Keep a clear area around the trunk of at least 60cm radius. Chill-hours for fruit development: Requires fewer chill-hours than other Apples. Pollinators: Jonathan, Pink Lady, Golden Delicious. Red Delicious or Cox's Orange Pippin are required nearby for this tree to pollinate and fruit successfully.</p>
