











<b>Tree</b>	 <p><b>Sophora (syn. Styphnolobium) japonica (syn. japonicum)</b> SCHOLAR TREE, JAPANESE PAGODA</p>
<b>Description</b>	This is an attractive medium to tall tree with rounded canopy grown for its white flowers, borne in late summer after most other flowering trees have long finished flowering. A beautiful shade tree, it produces a dark brown timber.
<b>Foliage</b>	 Deciduous
<b>Form</b>	 Broad-domed
<b>Mature Size</b>	12 x 10m
<b>Uses</b>	A tried and tested tree for urban environments, Sophora japonica is useful planted in parks, streetscapes and medium strips for example. As a specimen tree, it also makes a good shade.
<b>Position &amp; Soil</b>	This tree prefers a sunny, open location on any number of soil types and is tolerant of heat and drought.
