

# Eucalyptus tenuiramis



## SILVER PEPPERMINT TREE

This is a species originating in southeast Tasmania. It is reported as being an older form of its sister species, *E. risdonii*. The juvenile foliage is blue-green in colour and is often used in the florist industry. Its trunk is smooth white to grey, foliage is pendulous and bluish-grey with bark that is sometimes yellow. Buds, seed capsules and twigs are usually coated with a thick, glaucous wax.

This is a large tree for parks and gardens.

Although it is tolerant of most soils, prefers humus rich soil in full sun to part shade.
